Message from the Fire Chief

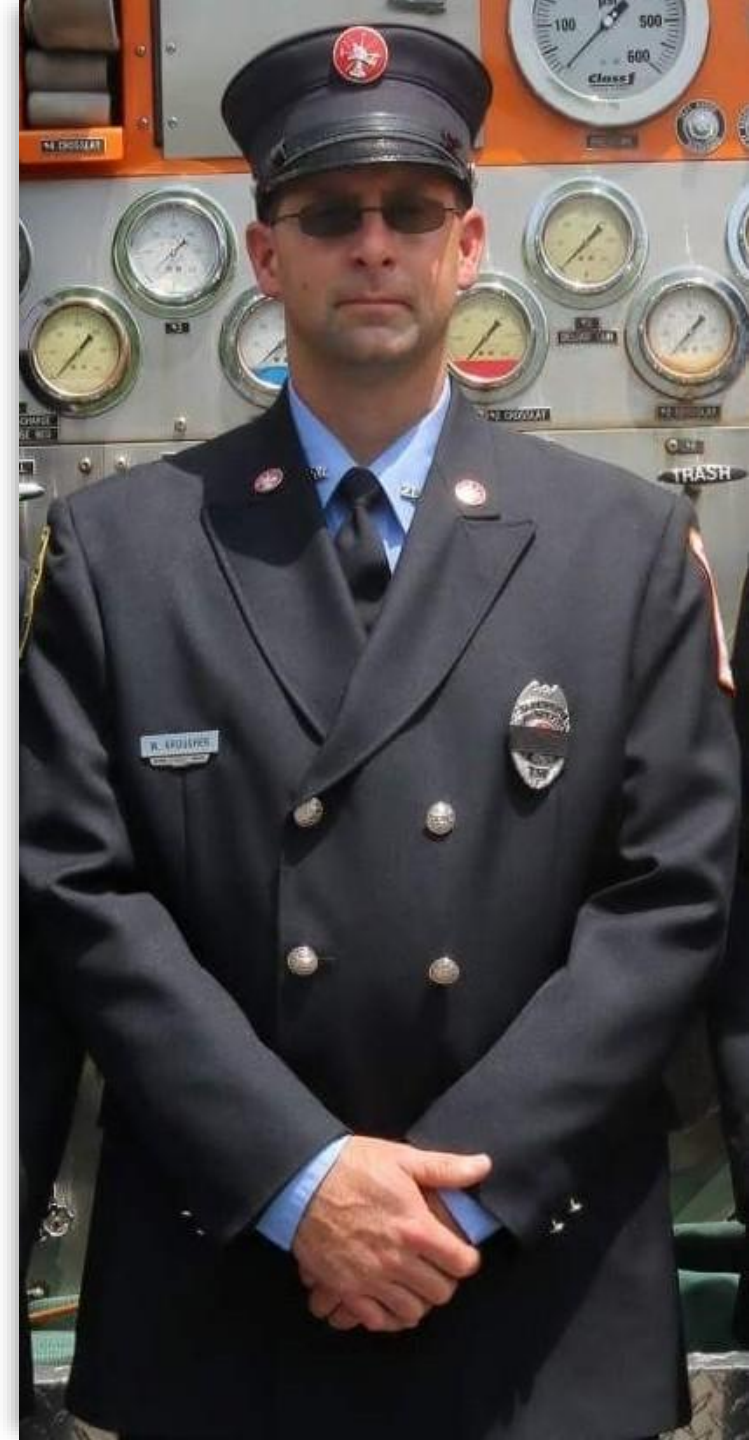

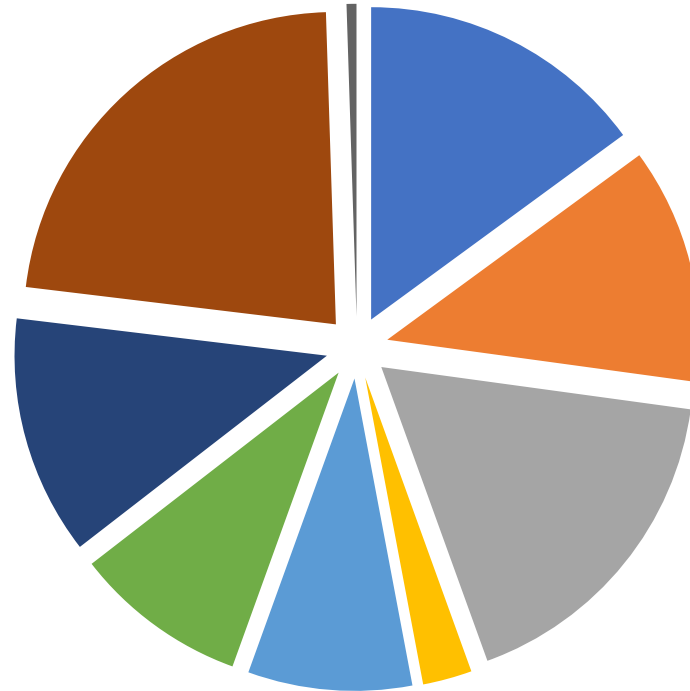

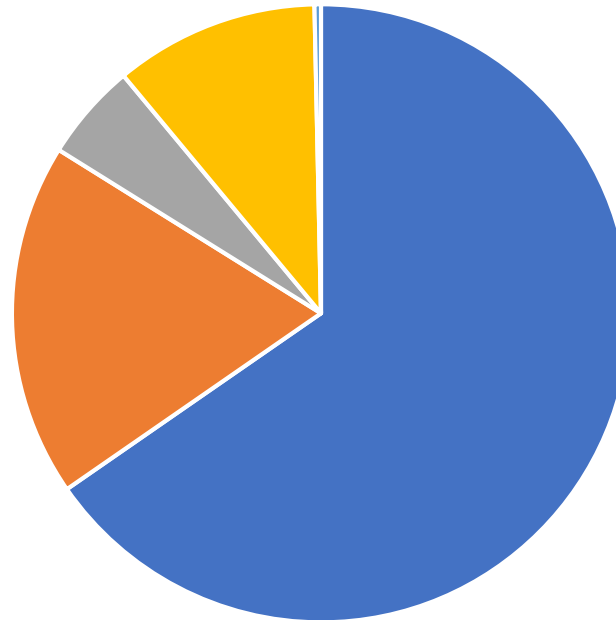

 - Replaces Rescue 20


